# Educational resources on National Indigenous History Month

June is National Indigenous History Month. It is a time for all Canadians to reflect on the unique histories, cultures, contributions, and strengths of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis Peoples in Canada – because only by understanding our past can we hope to create a brighter future.

National Indigenous History Month is a celebration of Indigenous history in the spirit of pride and reclamation. For non-Indigenous Canadians, it is an opportunity to learn and show recognition of the role Indigenous Peoples have played and continue to play in shaping Canada.

Additionally, June 21 marks National Indigenous Peoples Day, which is a further opportunity to recognize and celebrate the heritage, cultures, and contributions of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis peoples in Canada. According to the Government of Canada, “In cooperation with Indigenous organizations, the Government of Canada chose June 21, the summer solstice, for National Aboriginal Day, now known as National Indigenous Peoples Day. For generations, many Indigenous peoples and communities have celebrated their culture and heritage on or near this day due to the significance of the summer solstice as the longest day of the year.”
